

Parent Notice of Section §504/ADA Rights

Students and parents of students referred for §504/ADA services or receiving such services have the following rights.

- The right to be informed by the district of specific due process rights
- The right for the child to have access to equal academic and non-academic school activities
- The right for the child to have an appropriate education in the least restrictive setting, which includes accommodation, modification, and related services.
- The right to notice regarding referral, evaluation, and placement
- The right for the child to have a fair evaluation conducted by a knowledgeable person(s) prior to determining his/her appropriate placement or before a change in placement.
- The right to periodic evaluations of the child to determine if there has been a change in educational need, generally at least every three years
- The right to an administrative appeals process
- The right to examine and obtain copies of all school records

In addition, parents have the right to file a grievance in accordance with Nash-Rocky Mount Board of Education Policy 1740/4010. The policy is available on the Nash-Rocky Mount web site at www.nrms.k12.nc.us in the [Board of Education Policy Manual](#) or you may request a copy at your child's school.

If you believe that you have been discriminated against because of your race, color, national origin, disability, age, sex, or religion, you may file a complaint with the office of Civil Rights (OCR), U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, 61 Forsyth Street, S.W. – Suite 3B70, Atlanta, GA 30323; (404) 562-7886.
